Policy for Safeguarding Children and Young People

Parish of St Peter and St Paul Little Gaddesden, in the Church of England Diocese of St Albans

This Policy was agreed following consultation with the Parochial Church Council on 8th December 2022

- We are committed to implementing a safeguarding children policy and to be responsive to local parish requirements.
- As a PCC we formally adopt the Houses of Bishops' 'Promoting a Safer Church safeguarding policy statement 2017 'and work to the House of Bishops' safeguarding guidance, reporting the progress of our duty of compliance at each APCM.
- We will appoint a designated Parish Safeguarding Officer.
- We will review and endorse the Safeguarding Policies and Domestic Abuse Statement annually so that all members are aware of their responsibilities.
- The highest standards will be maintained in all the Church's contacts with children and young people and we will carefully select those working with children and young people's groups using the Safer Recruitment Checklist. These workers will be given appropriate support and opportunities for training. Safeguarding Activity Risk Assessments will be completed for each church activity including reference to the Parish Safer Images Policy.
- We will respond without delay to every complaint made that a child or young person for whom we are responsible may have been harmed.
- We will report any safeguarding incidents to the Diocesan Safeguarding Advisor and in compliance with the Charity Commission delegation of reporting guidance.
- This Parish will co-operate fully with the statutory agencies in every situation and will not conduct its own investigations.
- We will seek to offer informed pastoral care to any child or young person who has suffered abuse.
- We will care for and supervise any member of our church community known to have offended against a child or young person.
- The PCC acknowledges its responsibility for all work with children and young people
 done in the name of the Church and requires all those engaged in such work to be
 properly appointed and supported in accordance with the Church of England Practice
 Guidance: Safer Recruitment and People Management (June 2021) and the Parish
 Recruitment of Ex -Offenders Policy Statement.
